SBCA was chartered in 1979. In 1981, at age 65, I retired from my 42 ½-year career at a state agency and was elected Treasurer of SBCA effective 10-01-81. I served until early 2009, when Kathy Smartt became Treasurer.

Due to a 1981 vacancy in the Treasurer's job. President Phil Blackerby had also been serving as Treasurer. He turned over to me all financial records from the beginning in 1979, and I later received the earliest membership records from Peg Guarino. So these 13 file boxes contain records from 1979 to today. Our fiscal year is from October 1 through September 30 of the following year. Our mailing address has always been PO Box 5923, Austin, TX 78763 (Tarrytown Post Office) I think because David Bloch lived in West Austin.

From 10-01-81 to 10-01-93, I recorded receipts by writing in a journal the donor's name/address/telephone number plus amount of contribution, and then posted the info onto a card index file. On 10-01-93, I discontinued handwritten journals. I picked up SBCA mail at the post office, opened envelopes, and arranged the checks alphabetically. I walked next door to the Tarrytown Pharmacy, made two photocopies of the checks, and walked back to the post office. I prepared deposit slips and dropped the deposit envelope in the mail box.

Upon returning home, I used the check photocopies to complete the journal entries and post to the card file. I kept one page copy, and the second copy went to George Cofer, who sent thank-you letters and mailed any premiums due to the donors. Each year, George took my records to the accountant and CPA who prepared required annual reports.

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In consideration of my file boxes someday going to the Austin History Center, I believed it might not be appropriate to place photocopies of donor checks in the center. So I segregated these boxes #11, #12, #13 containing financial folders away from the first 10 boxes which contain handwritten journals through 09-30-92. SBCA and Austin History Center should decide how to handle photocopies of checks from 10-01-93 through 09-30-08 (the last fiscal year I handled).

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Except for financial record folders after 09-30-92, boxes #1 through #10 contain all SBCA files. At the end of box 10 are folders containing: Officers, Board members, Honoraries; City Council memberships from 1900 through 2012; codes used to identify the source of entries to the mailing list names; copyright info from Marshall Frech.

In August 2013, I read in the new Austin Environmental Directory that SBCA "intends to preserve her treasure trove of many large file boxes at the Austin History Center." At that time I had not worked on SBCA files since 2004 and had SBCA stuff in 5 different places, including several feet of single sheet newspapers I had saved to clip and file "later". (I read too much and clipped way too much). After screening the newspapers, I recycled about 95%, saving only SBCA, Austin Energy, and a few miscellaneous subjects. In that process, I discarded many clippings about Freeport-McMoran, BCCP, endangered species, Gary Bradley, and Zilker Park, even though my original 8 boxes contain many clippings on those subjects. I did not discard any clipping mentioning SBCA. I then filed and interfiled all the new items. (8 boxes became 10). Files are in chronological sequence.

It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as Treasurer of SBCA for 27 years.
